President's Column

NEAR-Fest has come and gone. We had typical NEAR-Fest weather - rain! Despite the conditions, Steve (WA1KBE) and I drove to NEAR-Fest to check out the bargains. I found a bunch of small electronic



parts that I can use, and Steve found a few deals of his own. I saw about a dozen club members at NEAR-Fest on Friday, and I hope everybody had a good time.

At our May PART meeting, our guest speaker will be Dave (KM3T) Pascoe, who will talk to us about WRTC 2014 - the World Radiosport Team Championship. This is a major event in amateur radio, and it will be held right here in New England! Dave tells me that central Massachusetts will be the epicenter of activity for this event. I'm looking forward to hearing Dave's talk and finding out how PART can help. As a premier club, I suspect a lot will be expected of us. It seems like a long way off, but time flies, and there is a lot to be done.

The Field Day committee recently gathered at the Concord Rod and Gun club. Lead by Field Day chairman Bob (W1IS), we settled on quite a few items. Most notably, our Field Day will be entirely QRP (5 watts or less) and every radio will be operating on battery power. Many people have told me stories about very real situations where QRP and battery was all they had, so this will be a great opportunity to practice those skills.

For those of you who believe that you can't do anything with 5W, consider that your HT probably outputs 5W or less, and with altitude,

one can communicate about 90-100 miles on 2m FM. By contrast, my longest contact on CW QRP HF was 5000 miles to Hawaii. At Field Day, you will be able to experience QRP operation and see for yourself the capabilities and challenges of low power operation.

With battery power comes additional challenges. Batteries are often big and heavy. Carelessness can give you a nasty shock (or worse!). We will be recharging batteries via solar power, so let's hope for a sunny weekend. Again, another opportunity to learn about batteries, battery charging, battery life while operating the radio, etc.

More details will be discussed at both the May and June PART meetings. Be sure to ask about the food and the special arrangements we're making for our newest members.

The K2H 13 Colonies special event is coming up quickly! This event will run from the end of June through the Independence day holiday. PART is the lead club out of 4 clubs participating in Massachusetts. The QSO counts have been rising exponentially over the last couple of years as this event becomes more popular. Last year, the pileups were tremendous, and a great training ground for learning to handle them. Charlie (K1PUB) once again has volunteered to lead this event. More will be said at the May and June PART meetings. Ask about the cool QSL card for K2H!

That's all for now! I'm looking forward to seeing you at the May PART meeting!

PART Field Day!

In my opinion, Field Day is the epitome of Ham Radio with many of the technical and operational aspects of the hobby that drew us to it in the first place. It is also a great place to learn about parts of the hobby that you may not be familiar with. We all can learn something at Field Day. But Field Day is also about operating, camaraderie, teamwork, socializing, food and just plain fun. So mark your calendar for June 23^{rd} and 24^{th} for PART Field Day. We start putting up antennas at 0830 on Saturday June 23^{rd} so we can be on the air by 1400. Tear down begins at 1400 on Sunday the 24^{th} and we will be clear of the Concord Rod and Gun Club by 1600.

Thanks to Joe, KB1SSA, we are indeed fortunate to once again have use of the Concord Rod and Gun Club for Field Day. It is an ideal and beautiful site.

The Field Day Committee met on May 8th to plan and make some decisions. We all agreed to make this year's Field Day a realistic exercise in Emergency Communications by operating QRP with batteries for all stations on all bands. We will operate in the 2A or 3A class with the free VHF station that class A allows. A satellite station is free for all classes. The choice of 2 or 3 simultaneous HF stations and whether we will operate straight through the 24-hour period depends on the number of operators we have and if some want to work the "graveyard shift." This will give us as many as 5 stations on-the-air simultaneously.



All our HF stations will use Elecraft K2's or maybe a KX3 or two if any of the four KX3's club members have ordered arrive on time! We will set up three operating HF stations, SSB, CW and Digital, and have a fourth receive only station for spotting new activity. We will also have a VHF station provided by Allison, KB1GMX, and Bob, KB1SWZ's, Satellite Station.

Current antenna plans call for using the two full size wire beams on 40 and 20 Meters and the G5RV that we used last year. Additionally, Fred, AB1OC, and Anita, AB1QB, will bring two Buddipole beams for 15 and 10 Meters that we will set up on the deck, and Scott, NE1RD, will bring a tri-band beam that we will set up along side the building. Completing the HF antenna farm will be Allison's, KB1GMX's, PAR 40-20-10 end fed. This set up and the filters we have will allow us to simultaneously operate two HF stations on different modes on the same band, something we have not been able to do before. Allison will bring her 6 and 2 Meter beams and Bob will have his portable satellite antennas as well.

In keeping with the Emergency operation, other than making simple exchange contacts, we will be sending and receiving formal traffic.

So sign up now to participate in the PART 2012 Field Day by sending me an email at rglorioso@comcast.net indicating if you will help set up and tear down, operate SSB, CW or Digital and preferred hours, or will come to see what is going on. If you have never operated Field Day or a contest before and want to try, we will have folks to help you get started, just let me know.

MEMA's MCST - Mobile Communications Support Trailer



MEMA has taken delivery of a new field response support trailer, the Mobile Communications Support Trailer (MCST). The MCST has been fully outfitted and is ready for deployment. This trailer can be requested by **any** community or agency in the Commonwealth through either the MEMA Regional offices or MEMA Headquarters for use in emergencies, preplanned events, and disasters. The MCST trailer is a specialized interoperable communications asset that can provide

communications support to incident commanders dealing with disasters, incidents, or pre-planned events, and help provide communications in areas with limited coverage by providing both on scene communications support and serve as a 're-trans' trailer for extending radio coverage. The trailer is specially equipped to provide interoperable communications in fringed or non-existent coverage areas of a disaster or event. The trailer also serves as a Wi-Fi "hot spot" allowing internet connectivity and also can be used as a hub for cellular and satellite telephone service. In addition, the trailer has a unique 10' total height to allow for bridge/tunnel travel statewide.

FCC Seeks Higher Vanity Call Sign Fee

May 07, 2012 - The FCC released a *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* (*NPRM*) on May 4, seeking to raise the fee for Amateur Radio vanity call signs. Currently, a vanity call sign costs \$14.20 and is good for 10 years; the new fee, if the FCC plan goes through, will go up to \$15 for 10 years, an increase of 80 cents. The FCC is authorized by the *Communications Act of 1934 (as amended)* to collect vanity call sign fee...

Repeater Information

Repeater Interference

The 146.955 repeater continues to see interference to existing conversations as well as at random quiet times throughout the day and night. The repeater interference committee needs your help in collecting data. If you hear any type of interference, please report the following info to "**repeater**" at "wb1gof.org":



- Time: When did the event happen?
- Observing location: Where were you? Were you mobile?
- Frequency: Input only (146.355 MHz)
- What you heard: Voices, tones, kerchunking or whatever.
- Signal strength: Either by ear (noisy, quiet or full quiet) or S meter
- Radio: To get an idea of the reporter's radio situation.

* Most important - what direction: How did you determine direction? This is the most essential piece of information. Even if it's an estimate as in "Roughly east" or "from the Northeast" it's useful. NEVER EVER reply or direct any thing to the sick person causing the interference. Because some of us have answered this person, he knows we are aware of him and that is what keeps him doing it. Also since you are communicating with a non IDing station you are operating just as illegally as he is. YOU ARE BROADCASTING! NEVER TALK ABOUT INTERFERENCE on air. NEVER


EmComm events and repeater use

Most everyone knows that the 146.955 repeater is used during times of emergency situations, drills and exercises. Skywarn and the monthly EmComm drills are the normal events.

So what does this mean to those that are just looking for regular QSOs with other users? It means that if you are in a regular QSO and there is a significant weather situation that has been getting press/air-time lately, you can expect that if severe weather develops in our area, the folks from Taunton-WX1BOX may interrupt a QSO and ask anyone on frequency what may be happening weather wise. The BOX operator will probably ask for specific information, hail, wind damage, property dame from lightning or wind, etc. Please give him the information he needs or tell him that you've not heard of any such activity. You don't need to tell him it is sunny in Nashua!

There may come a time when an unexpected emergency situation arises. These will significant events that may affect life and property. This is where EmComm activity may step in. Usually an NCS will interrupt a QSO and announce the situation and ask for a QSO to cease or to be "aware" of the possibility of priority calls/traffic. Please make sure you leave breaks between transmissions so stations with traffic can get in between QSOs. If there is enough traffic, it may be necessary for your existing/interrupted QSO QSY to another frequency. You should use your best judgment or check with the NCS on what he feels is best.

If you have any questions, please feel free to correspond with either Hugh-N1QGE (Westford EmComm/Skywarn NCS) or Terry-KA8SCP (MEMA Region 1 Communications Officer and Skywarn NCS). They will be more than happy to talk about these programs with you.


The PART Quartermaster has lots of great PART-ware for sale including mugs and shirts. You can get information how you can obtain your PART-ware at the monthly club meetings.

EmComm

Emergency Communications – The WB1GOF 146.955 repeater is used on the first Monday of every month (except federal/state holidays) for an EmComm Net starting at 1930 local time. If you are interested in being part of the local emergency communications team in your community, feel free to contact any of the following folks: Terry Stader – KA8SCP, MEMA Region 1 Communications Officer Hugh Maguire – N1QGE, for the Town of Westford Bill Ohm – W1OHM, for the Town of Chelmsford





Skywarn - The WB1GOF 146.955 repeater is also used for reporting significant weather events to the National Weather Service from our local spotters. We expect to have a local Skywarn training class in 2010, more information as it becomes available. You can provide valuable information even if you have not attended one of the training sessions. Listen to the Skywarn Net Control Station for reporting criteria, when you have information that qualifies, please advise him with your report.

Situational Awareness - Recently, the Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency has asked the

Amateur Radio community to provide situational awareness and disaster intelligence information within your local community via EmComm nets and/or Skywarn stations. Significant events such as widespread power outages can be reported and by agencies such as MEMA to evaluate the scope of a blackout for example. Initially, you should try and contact the EmComm Net Control Stations on the Westford 146.955 repeater to pass this information. More on this new program will be forthcoming.

PART Sunday Night Net – The PART Net each Sunday night is an IMPORTANT part of our regional EmComm function. With each station that checks in from the surrounding communities, we test our ability to communicate vital information to the ham radio community. Sure we announce club info but we can also communicate regional disaster news and serve as a "hub" for news of situations in our communities. The repeater is on a generator, so even if we loose power in the region, an HT with a supply of batteries will reconnect you to other local hams.
